NCJW launches Stuff for School program

The National Council of Jewish Women (NCJW) has launched its annual Stuff for School program. This year's effort will provide school supplies for 13,500 students in 30 Minneapolis Public Schools.

The program offers the basic tools that young students need to learn and succeed at school. Through the generosity of individuals and corporate sponsors, NCJW volunteers purchase, assemble and deliver school supplies for kindergarten through eighth grade students.

This year's volunteers also committed to go green, separating discarded paper and plastic for recycling, and coordinating deliveries by school location to reduce gas usage and emissions.

Now in its 11th year, Stuff for School has served nearly 130,000 low-income students in need. The
